There have been several instances when children who participated in Camp 911 were able to use the skills learned in real life situations. A student was home alone and cut himself on a soup can lid and knew to call 911 for assistance. Several students saw a van with a suspicious subject in it and called out "Stranger Danger" and ran back into the school. Most recently a student was able to actually save her grandfather's life using the knowledge she gained from a previous Camp!
