RESOLUTION NO. R2005-38

Marvin Perzee, President of the Iroquois County Fair, addressed the Board with a brief history of the fair. County Fairs have taken place in Iroquois County for nearly 150 years; since the 1860's under various names and in various locations, such as Middleport, Onarga, Milford, and since 1961, rural Crescent City. The County Fairgrounds now consist of 37 structures on a total of 80 acres of land. A typical fair year sees 650 4-H participants; 200 FFA & agriculture participants; 2,500 exhibitors; and 5,000 exhibits. Iroquois County ranks ninth in the state of Illinois for number of exhibits. Additionally, the fairgrounds host 30 to 35 events annually which vary in nature and help to contribute to the local economy. Mr. Perzee noted the fair does not operate with local tax money and receives minimal assistance from the State. He said recently issues have come upon the fair, namely a problem with water; not quality, but quantity. A meeting was held to address the problem and included local officials and a number of legislators. Mr. Perzee closed by appealing to the County Board to show their support for the Iroquois County fair in the form of a resolution or proclamation. It was moved by John Dowling and seconded to authorize the State's Attorney to prepare a resolution to show the County Board's full support for the Iroquois County Fair. The motion carried by a roll call vote. The resolution will be sent to legislative leadership and the media.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on July 1, 2005 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were John Dowling, Wayne Hiles, Donna Wasmer, and Betty Busick. Also present were John Wilkening County Board Vice-Chairman; Brian Martell, Solid Waste Coordinator; and Sue Rieches, Community Development Specialist for East Central Illinois Community Action Agency.

Dr. James Finnell, Animal Control Administrator, was unable to attend the Committee meeting. Copies of the Animal Control Report for the month of June were distributed. There were a total of 10 stray dog calls, 11 bite cases, 6 nuisance and welfare calls, and 35 dogs impounded for

the month of June.

There was some discussion regarding the Elizabeth Brown case. The case is now considered to be over and the County will not be responsible for boarding any of Mrs. Brown's dogs because all of the dogs have been sent elsewhere with the exception of four, which still remain in her care. There was also some discussion concerning a Milford resident who has 14 dogs at her residence and claims she does not need to have them vaccinated and registered or obtain a kennel license because the dogs are pets.

The Committee also discussed the cost and requirements for Dan Garner to become certified by the state to euthanize dogs. Further discussion will be held concerning this matter.

Brian Martell, Solid Waste Coordinator, distributed copies of the Operating & Volume Report for the period ending June 15, 2005. The current market prices are as follows: newspaper \$60/ton, aluminum \$.48/lb, glass \$10/ton, tin \$55/ton, magazines \$40/ton, white paper \$50/ton and cardboard \$50/ton. Brian noted the amount of glass collected has tripled and the amount of cardboard collected has almost doubled from the previous month. Brian also said he will be submitting a press release to announce the recipients of the two \$500 scholarships which are sponsored by ACI Enterprises.

Sue Rieches spoke to the Committee about some of the services and programs available through the East Central Illinois Community Action Agency. Sue said there are weatherization funds available for 11 more applicants. She stated all energy funds are used up and the agency is waiting to hear if the state will be providing funding for a summer energy program. Sue told the Committee how she and one other employee rotate their schedules so they can accommodate people in several different communities. She also spoke about the Head Start program which is for 3 and 4 year old children.

The Committee talked briefly about possible changes to be made to the water system at the fairgrounds and how the fair has lost over \$20,000 in funding from the state in the past two years. It is not clear at this time if the state or local agencies are requesting the changes be made.

The Committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Wayne Hiles and seconded to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

As there was no further business to come before the Committee, a motion was made by Donna Wasmer and seconded to adjourn at 9:43 A.M. Motion carried.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on July 5, 2005, at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Jerry Haynes, John Kuntz, David Pree, and Alan Benjamin. Also present were Mark Henrichs, County Clerk; Jerome Manos, Chief County Assessment Officer; Tom Tuntland, County Programmer; Donna Schmitz, Director of Data Processing; and John Wilkening, County Board Vice-Chairman.

Chief County Assessment Officer Jerome Manos reported the Farmland Assessment Review Committee met on June 22nd. They certified the 2006 farmland values, using Bulletin 810 data as mandated by statute. Jerome noted County Programmer Tom Tuntland is meeting the Assessment office needs with programming changes. It is possible more changes may be necessary.

The Assessment office is completing the assessor changes. They will reconcile abstracts and

equalize where necessary. Notices will be printed and mailed and changes will be published. Changes due to County applied equalization do not require individual notice or publication. The Board of Review will be called in to accept written complaints for 30 days.

Director of Data Processing Donna Schmitz reported an IMRF workshop was held in the County Board room with 27 in attendance. Donna said she has been working on helping to get the tax bills out and making any corrections as necessary.

County Programmer Tom Tuntland distributed his activity report for the month. Tom said it was discovered that exemption calculations on some tax bills were incorrect because the method that the calculations were made has been done several different ways. He said of the 13 programs which include exemption calculations, none were done identically, all had minor flaws, and some had serious flaws. Tom and Jerome have worked to discover the correct way for the exemptions to be calculated and in the future all 13 programs will use the same process. Approximately 300 to 400 tax bills had to be corrected, or approximately 2% of the total bills. It was the consensus of the Committee that the corrections were made in the best manner possible and it appears the problem has been resolved.

The Committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by John Kuntz and seconded to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

County Clerk Mark Henrichs distributed the monthly financial reports for the County Clerk and the Recorder's office.

Mark reported a list of properties obtained by the County in accordance with the delinquent tax sale procedure has been received from County Trustee Dennis Ballinger. The County Board requests the voiding of the tax bills for these parcels. It was moved by David Pree and seconded to approve the voiding of the tax bills as listed by Delinquent Tax Agent Dennis Ballinger. Motion carried.

Mark discussed SB75, known as the Rental Housing Support Program Act, which was recently signed by the Governor. Effective August 1, 2005 all Illinois County Recorders must collect the \$10 surcharge for each recorded real estate-related document. \$9 of the \$10 collected for each document will be sent monthly to the Illinois Department of Revenue to fund the Rental Housing Support Program. Mark said there are several issues still somewhat unclear, including exactly how the funds will be allocated and what types of documents will be exempt from the surcharge. He is expecting further details. Mark said a resolution will be needed to increase recording fees effective August 1st. It was moved by John Kuntz and seconded to request the State's Attorney draft a resolution to increase recording fees by \$10, effective August 1, 2005, in accordance with Senate Bill 75. Motion carried.

As there was no further business to come before the Committee it was moved by Alan Benjamin and seconded to adjourn at 10:25 A.M. Motion carried.

Your Committee met at the Courthouse on July 6, 2005, at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Rick Curtis, John Kuntz, Alan DeWitt, Betty Busick, Susan Wynn, David Pree, and Phyllis Jameson. Also present were Mike Power, Probation Supervisor; Arlene Hines, Circuit Clerk; Carl Gerdovich, ESDA Coordinator; Bill Cheatum, Coroner; Judge Gordon Lustfeldt; Ron Schroeder, County Board Chairman; and John Wilkening, County Board Vice-Chairman.

Judge Gordon Lustfeldt reported law library books were received and distributed. He said the books are delivered to the County Clerk's office and he is unable to reroute the delivery of them.

Judge Lustfeldt also reported the lack of cooperation with the Iroquois County Mental Health Center to conduct evaluations. He has contacted the center numerous times over the years to perform evaluations and has been turned down and has had to hire outside the county for these services.

Coroner Bill Cheatum distributed copies of his report for June 2005. There were four inquests, one inquest pending, seven coroner's certificates issued, eighteen coroner calls transferred to medical death certificates, and five cremation permits issued.

Mike Power, Probation Supervisor reported his department has two Nextel phone contracts which expire in July and will be cancelled due to outdated equipment. He also has two phones which will be upgraded; leaving his department short two phones.

Arlene Hines, Circuit Clerk distributed her report for June 2005. Arlene said collections increased over \$8,000 from May.

Arlene also reported she purchased a new copy machine for her department. The old copier will be cleaned and given to the Sheriff's department for their use. Arlene noted it is still in good working condition, but due to the high volume of copies she felt it necessary to upgrade before it needed immediate replacement.

The Committee discussed a union grievance that has been filed against the County by the Probation department. The grievance claims approximately \$10 per month is being deducted from employees payroll for single medical insurance coverage. The union has a "Me Too" clause in effect since April, 2004 changing the deduction of approximately \$10 per month to \$0 per month for single medical insurance coverage. Judge Clark Erickson will rule on the case in Kankakee.

Carl Gerdovich, ESDA Coordinator, distributed copies of his report for June 2005 and highlighted meetings he attended.

Carl has invited Dan Smith, Regional ESDA Coordinator, to address the full board in August to discuss ESDA plans. Carl will confirm and take appropriate action to add him to the August agenda.

Carl reported he has received tentative approval on the terrorism plan he has submitted. However, there are approximately eight to ten points that require some fine tuning.

There was further discussion as to who has the authority to sound the siren in communities when threatening weather arises.

Additionally, Carl addressed the issue of having a pager which would tie in the surrounding fire departments when alarms are activated. Milford Fire Chief Frank Hines is looking into the details of the pager.

The Committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Phyllis Jameson and seconded to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on July 7, 2005, at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Lowell Schmidt, Russell Bills, Jerry Haynes, Jim Meyer, John Dowling, Phyllis Jameson, and Susan Wynn. Also present were Mark Henrichs, County Clerk; Donna Schmitz, Director of Data Processing; Sheriff Eldon Sprau; and County Board Chairman Ron Schroeder.

Committee Chairman Lowell Schmidt said Doug & Cheryl Smith are interested in purchasing a bank-owned building in Donovan with the intent of opening an internet diner. The Smiths currently do not live in Iroquois County but are looking at homes in the area. They are interested in obtaining a loan from the Revolving Loan Fund for their venture. Mrs. Smith provided the Committee with copies of her business proposal and application. Following discussion, it was the consensus of the Committee that additional information is needed, such as a detailed business plan and cash flow projections before further consideration can be made.

County Clerk Mark Henrichs distributed copies of the County Summary of Current Taxes Extended. The Committee reviewed the report which itemized where property tax revenues come from, such as residential property, farm, commercial, industrial, etc., as well as where the money goes, such as schools, villages, and other taxing bodies. The Committee noted tax revenue from farm ground has decreased significantly over the last several years. The formula used to arrive at farmland value is set by the state. The Committee agreed the State should be made aware of how adversely this affects Iroquois County by continually lowering the EAV. Further discussion will be held; possibly a resolution may be in order.

Mark briefly discussed SB75, the Rental Housing Support Program Act, recently signed into law by the Governor. Beginning August 1, 2005, an additional \$10 will be charged for the recording of any property-related document. The County gets to keep only \$1 per document for administering the new fee.

The Committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by John Dowling and seconded to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

Sheriff Eldon Sprau said last month a vote to place a Public Safety Tax referendum on the ballot was passed by the County Board. He now has several questions, such as who will be responsible to pursue the issue; will it be promoted, and if so, by whom; and at what election will the question be placed on the ballot. The Committee agreed public safety is an important issue facing Iroquois County and a Public Safety Tax is not just for the construction of a new jail. Both officers and equipment for the Sheriff's Department are badly needed. It was also agreed the referendum will fail to pass without promotion. Sheriff Sprau said Kimme and Associates does provide promotional services and he can obtain a cost estimate. How much money would have to be spent to promote, and where this money will come from was also discussed. Additionally, what Committee should now take over these duties was considered, as well as the possibility of forming a committee of citizens from across the County to help with promotion.

Sheriff Sprau also reported the FOP union - Sergeants and Lieutenants, consisting of six employees, want to go to arbitration.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on July 8, 2005, at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Alan Benjamin, Jim Meyer, Harriett Mowrey, Donna Wasmer, Merle Lemenager, and Beryl Luecke. Also present were Gloria Schleef, Zoning Administrator; Debbie Wright, Chief Deputy Zoning Clerk; County Board member Jerry Haynes, Ron Schroeder, County Board Chairman; and Erin Doss from the *Times-Republic*.

Mandy Slaughter, property owner at Spring Creek Campground, addressed the Committee with several concerns. The Crescent Lot Owners Association has been asked to re-write their guidelines. Ms. Slaughter said she does not believe they intend to do this or to comply with County regulations in any way, although they have indicated in a letter to Chairman Schroeder that they will abide by all state and county guidelines and building codes as they apply. Chairman Benjamin said it may be the County's obligation to inform all lot owners individually what the County's rules and

regulations are, that they apply to the entire County, and that there may be penalties for non-compliance.

County Board member Jerry Haynes discussed a possible industrial development re-zoning request coming to the Committee in the near future. Because of a tight construction schedule, the applicants have respectfully requested that their application be handled as expeditiously as possible in keeping within the rules and legal requirements for public notices, etc. It was the consensus of the Committee that special meetings may be required and appropriate for this re-zoning request, should it come about.

Zoning Administrator Gloria Schleef reported on the following:

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The Zoning Board of Appeals is still in need of two members. Gloria recommended the appointment of Betty Thompson of Ashkum and Brad Howe of Danforth. Both have agreed to serve on the Board. It was moved by Donna Wasmer and seconded to appoint Betty Thompson and Brad Howe to the Zoning Board of Appeals. Motion carried.

The Regional Planning Commission has three members whose terms will expire in August. Following discussion, it was moved by Jim Meyer and seconded to appoint Mike Moran of Milford and to re-appoint Harold Loy of Beaverville and Beryl Luecke of Buckley. Motion carried. The fifteen-member Commission is still in need of one additional member.

Regional Planning has a very full agenda in August, with seven confirmed requests and possibly two additional requests as well. Gloria has also been asked to move two requests scheduled for September to August. She told the Committee she will advise the two scheduled for September that they can be heard in August only if there is a cancellation.

Following a brief recess, a public meeting was called to order by Chairman Alan Benjamin for the purpose of hearing one Conditional Use request and one Preliminary Plat request.

Darryl Daniels would like to build a new house on his father's property in Middleport Township. There is an old existing house on the property which will be torn down. He is requesting a Conditional Use to replace the house. He would like to split approximately four to five acres from his father's wooded eighteen-acre parcel. Both Regional Planning and Zoning Board of Appeals approved his request unanimously. Following brief discussion, it was moved by Merle Lemenager and seconded to **approve** this Conditional Use request. Roll call vote. Motion carried unanimously.

Kenneth Polson of Belmont Township has an existing house on an approximate five-acre parcel.
