Your committee to whom was referred **Health Services** would beg leave to submit the following report on the matters before them:

Your committee met at the Administrative Center on June 30, 2008 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Donna Wasmer, Betty Busick, Rod Copas, and Jean Hiles. Also present were Dr. James Finnell, Animal Control Administrator; Doug Corbett, Ford-Iroquois Public Health Administrator; Brian Martell, Solid Waste Coordinator; John Wilkening, County Board Vice Chairman, and Gene Breeden from G&D Salvage.

Dr. Finnell distributed copies of the Animal Control Report for the period ending June 26, 2008. There were a total of 4 stray dog calls, 4 bite cases, 2 registration violations, 1 welfare call, and 12 dogs impounded. Four dogs were taken to the Vermilion County Welfare Kennel for adoption. One specimen was sent to the University of Illinois Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory to be tested for rabies.

Dr. Finnell said the two most important things he learned from attending the Noah's Wish Disaster Response Training was that their definition of an emergency is 100 or more households evacuated for more than 24 hours and that they estimate there would be 2 animals from every household. Dr. Finnell said there were only 76 animals evacuated in the flooding which took place earlier this year and it would be hard to justify such a serious expense. He recommends setting up a staging area if a similar event should occur and getting provisions from area veterinarians. He said the training was very educational though. He also stressed the importance of photographing all animals who have been evacuated to help prevent identity problems later.

Gene Breeden, owner of G&D Salvage in Loda, was introduced to the committee. He said he is interested in taking over the recycling center. He would relocate it to Loda, but have distribution centers throughout the county. He answered several questions from the committee and invited them to visit his facility. He told the committee he now employs 10 people and has recently purchased a large number of trailers. He said mobile collection units are needed because people cannot afford to drive to recycle and it must be convenient for them to do so. Mr. Breeden said he will give the committee a proposal if they are interested. The committee said they will continue to think about and discuss this matter.

Brian Martell, Solid Waste Coordinator, said only one bid was received for the new roof which is needed on a building used mainly for storage at the recycling center. He said the estimate included tearing off and disposing of the shingles. It was the opinion of the committee that more than one bid is needed. It was also noted the bid should specify 30# felt, the brand of shingles used and certificate of insurance. Brian said he will place another ad for bids.

Doug Corbett, Ford-Iroquois Public Health Administrator, passed out copies of the statistical report for the first quarter. He said food inspections more than doubled because of flood related issues. Private sewage and domestic well inspections were up as well. He said the tobacco program will change drastically in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter. He said the department will pay for products such as patches and gum as long as participants keep calling the hot line. They receive vouchers to purchase these products. He said the program is being promoted at the upcoming parade. He also spoke about the car seat loan program and said there is no grant money left for this. He said Wal Mart

recently brought 4 car seats to be used in the program. He said the problem is that they cannot take used seats because of insurance issues.

Doug said what he fears most is a letter from the governor stating some programs may be cut such as elder abuse. In answer to a question concerning medicare payments, he said the agency is lucky to get payments within 12 months.

He said there are 95 health departments in the state and the Ford-Iroquois Public Health Department is ranked #1 in the state, due in large part because it is already an accredited agency. He said it took 2½ years to be accredited and he said that is due mostly to the foresight of his predecessor, Dr. John Pickering. He said the agency currently employs 37 full time and 7 part-time employees.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Jean Hiles and seconded to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, a motion was made by Rod Copas and seconded to adjourn at 10:26 A.M. Motion carried.

Your committee met at the Administrative Center on July 1, 2008 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Jerry Haynes, John Kuntz, Dale Schultz, Betty Busick, Kevin Hansen, Troy Krumwiede, and Jim Hurt. Also present were Mindy Kuntz Hagan, Treasurer; Yvonne Doggett, Chief Deputy Treasurer; Tom Tuntland, Director of County Information Systems; Bob Yergler, Supervisor of Assessments; Cecelia Dixon, Director of Data Processing; Mark Henrichs, County Clerk; John Wilkening, County Board Vice Chairman; and Steve Connell of Devnet, Inc.

Devnet sales representative Steve Connell was asked to make a presentation on behalf of his company. Devnet specializes in the development of fully-integrated software solutions for local government; specifically, property tax administration software. Iroquois County's "tax master" program was written by the County Programmer several years ago and is currently administered and maintained in-house by the Director of County Information Systems. The program is becoming obsolete. Additionally, it is hoped that an updated system would help with a more "timely" tax bill; possibly providing the capability to work in more than one tax year at a time.

Mr. Connell distributed information and gave a power point presentation. His company is one of the leaders in governmental software solutions and has among its clients 40 of the 102 Illinois counties. The Property Tax Administration Software features property tax assessment, tax calculation, tax billing, collection and distribution, and parcel record scanning. The Computer Assisted Mass Appraisal (CAMA) Software features replacement cost approach, sales ratio module, comparable property analysis, sketching and imaging, multiple regression analysis, and land appraisal. The programs are window based and user-friendly. The pricing structure includes data conversion, training and retraining, software upgrades, and technical assistance, including on and off-site support. The committee discussed the functions and capabilities of the program. It was noted the Devnet program does provide the capability to work in more than one tax year at a time, but only after the Board of Review work is completed, which is not much different from the County's current program capabilities in that respect. Mr. Connell told the committee pricing is based on the number of parcels, the number of years of history the County wishes to convert, and whether the CAMA software will be purchased. He will meet with Bob Yergler to obtain needed information and prepare a quote to submit to the County.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by John Kuntz and seconded to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

County Clerk Mark Henrichs said eight of eight Iroquois County School districts have approved and submitted the required resolution to ask the County Board to place the 1% school sales tax referendum on the November ballot. The Policy and Procedure Committee will discuss in further detail.

Mark reported the 2007 County EAV, including TIF, is \$405,170,485. The 2006 County EAV was \$393,554,485.

Director of Data Processing Cecelia Dixon said she has spoken with attorney Patrick Murphy who represents a large share of the County's drainage districts. Cecelia will meet with Mr. Murphy to work on identifying and correcting issues to make the drainage roll process more efficient.

Treasurer Mindy Kuntz Hagan said tax bill printing began Thursday morning and was completed by Friday evening. The process went smoothly and on Saturday morning the tax bills

were mailed.

Director of County Information Systems Tom Tuntland said 16 of 27 computer upgrades have been completed. He said additionally, anti-virus upgrades need to be completed on 38 computers. There will be no cost for the anti-virus upgrades, just time consuming. Tom noted that since he began working for the County in 2004 he has completed 153 major program repairs on the county's tax cycle software, proof of the need for an updated program.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Troy Krumwiede and seconded to adjourn at 11:07 A.M. Motion carried.

Your committee met at the Administrative Center on July 1, 2008, at 9:00 A.M. Larry Pankey, Maintenance Supervisor, reported on the following:

- The static and feedback that were affecting the phone lines have been fixed at the Courthouse. There are still calls that come in at the Administrative Center that are affected but with a little fine tuning the problems should cease.
- Trane was called to fix a fan that was damaged due to a lightning strike. The bill for parts was \$1,200 and will be covered by insurance.
- ESDA received new phones that are compatible with the new phone system that was installed in the Courthouse.
- The construction of the wall in the former break room at the east end of the Administrative Center will begin during the month of July. The room will then become a paper supply room with access limited to Data Processing and Maintenance personnel.
- Doug Hettinger was hired to fill one of the positions open in the Maintenance Department. Interviews are being conducted to fill the position of Ron Kissack who retired on June 30.
- The fourth of July fireworks display that is put on in the city of Watseka will once again be held on the curve to the south of the Courthouse. The parking lots at the Courthouse and Administrative Center will be used by spectators for viewing the display. In anticipation of trash being left behind, Larry will talk to Probation about the possibility of recruiting juveniles to gather any refuse left on the County property.
- The work that has to be done in order to certify the elevator and dumbwaiter at the Courthouse will begin within the next few weeks.

Committee Chairman Harriett Mowrey said that the inventory at the Administrative Center is almost complete with only two departments remaining. There is an abundance of outdated and broken electrical equipment that belongs to various offices other than the County including the FSA office and 911. The committee discussed options such as holding an electronic recycling day to get rid of the excess equipment and free up needed storage space. It was decided that all possible owners need to be notified before anything is removed and no further action was taken at this time.

Your committee met at the Courthouse on July 2, 2008 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were John Kuntz, Susan Wynn Bence, Lowell Schmidt, John Wilkening, Donna Crow, Alan DeWitt, and Rod Copas. Also present were Judge Jim Kinzer; Arlene Hines, Circuit Clerk; State's Attorney Jim Devine; ESDA Coordinator Carl Gerdovich; Barb King, Probation Supervisor; Bill Cheatum, Coroner; and Scott Rosenberger, citizen of Stockland Township.

Judge Jim Kinzer reported translator expenses will continue to increase as the need arises. He said Judge Lustfeldt is expected to return sometime in November or December.

Scott Rosenberger from Stockland Township expressed concern about the lack of radio coverage in his area. Officers who respond to calls cannot make contact on their radios when in the area. He would like to know what the protocol is to rectify the situation. Following discussion, it was suggested Mr. Rosenberger attend a 911 meeting. The next scheduled 911 meeting will be held July 8<sup>th</sup> in the County Board room at 7 p.m. At that time he can discuss the technical aspects of radio coverage in the Stockland area.

Barb King, Probation Supervisor, reported her department has finished gathering information on past clients for Redeploy Illinois, a program designed to help keep juvenile offenders out of the juvenile Department of Corrections. Barb said the state suggested Iroquois County join forces with

Kankakee County to obtain a grant for the program.

Barb reported the GPS program is going well and they are continuing to send out monthly bills. The contract between Secure Alert and the county currently has a 10% discounted period for the next five months for the GPS units.

Barb reported juvenile detention costs are up. The department is expecting reimbursement from DCFS for approximately \$6,000 for a juvenile who was a ward of the state for 65 days in Danville.

Barb said they have received some applications for the Probation Officer position and will be interviewing over the next few weeks. The goal is to have the position filled by August.

Coroner Bill Cheatum reported for the month of June there were twenty-one deaths, two autopsies, six coroner's certificates issued, fifteen calls transferred back to a doctor, and eight cremation permits issued. Bill also reported there were two suicides, and one drug overdose.

Circuit Clerk Arlene Hines distributed her report for June 2008 and answered questions. She reported an employee from her department recently celebrated their 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary with the county.

ESDA Coordinator Carl Gerdovich reported the mitigation application submitted to Springfield was approved and is awaiting approval from FEMA in Chicago. He reported working with Stantec and Jim Devine on language changes in the contract between Iroquois County and Stantec for the mitigation plan.

Carl reported the disaster exercise meeting scheduled in June was cancelled and is rescheduled for July 9<sup>th</sup> at 7p.m. in the County Board Room.

The committee briefly discussed the position of Assistant ESDA Director. It was moved by Susan Wynn Bence and seconded to appoint Michael Johnson of Sheldon to Assistant ESDA Coordinator on a voluntary basis with no salary, with the exception of expenses incurred. Motion carried.

An issue was raised concerning a claim for the IQ-ESDA website. Questions were asked pertaining to citizen's awareness of the county's own website. There was no action taken.

State's Attorney Jim Devine reported on claims for two psychiatrists, which were necessary for an evaluation for a sexually dangerous person. These claims will put him over budget, however it was needed to proceed with the case.

Jim reported the schools in Iroquois County have submitted requests for a one percent sales tax increase to be placed on the ballot in November. He reviewed a *Certification of Minutes and Resolution* submitted by one of the schools. There was discussion as to whether the County Board actually has to vote to place the question on the ballot in the November General Election. Jim said he would further review the matter. There will be an attorney at the Policy & Procedure meeting on Monday from a bonding organization to address the committee on the sales tax issue.

Jim reported there will be Grand Jury tomorrow for the month of July.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Donna Crow and seconded to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Copas voted Nay. Motion carried.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Susan Wynn Bence and seconded to adjourn at 10:52 A.M. Motion carried.

Your committee met at the Administrative Center on July 3, 2008 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Jim Meyer, Russell Bills, Jerry Haynes, Harriett Mowrey, Lowell Schmidt, and Susan Wynn Bence. Also present were Roger Schuldt, Schuldt Insurance; Mindy Kuntz Hagan, Treasurer; Bob Yergler, Supervisor of Assessments; Cecelia Dixon, Director of Data Processing; Ron Schroeder, County Board Chairman; and Wendy Davis from the *Times-Republic*.

Roger Schuldt, Schuldt Insurance, reported the Highway Department deleted a 1995 International dump truck on June 13<sup>th</sup>. On June 15<sup>th</sup> a lightening strike caused damage to an air conditioner condenser and possibly additional items. Larry will submit any further bills for damage to Schuldt Insurance.

Supervisor of Assessments Bob Yergler reported his office is busy with the normal number of complaints following the mailing of tax bills. Bob discussed the process which taxpayers should take to file complaints in his office.

He briefly discussed the 1% sales tax referendum proposal, noting that schools are not receiving State money for buildings. The revenue from the sales tax is for just that purpose and can

be used for construction only.

Treasurer Mindy Kuntz Hagan reported the May Public Defender's salary reimbursement has been received from the State. She said there have been no recent payments on the Blunk loan. The information has been turned over to the State's Attorney. Mindy said tax collection has been steady with many early taxpayers paying both installments at once.

Cecelia Dixon, Director of Data Processing, reported the mileage allowance rate has increased as of July 1, 2008 to 58.5 cents per mile.

Cecelia said she is getting ready for budget hearings, but has a conflict with the normal hearing dates due to an IMRF training session. The committee decided on August 13, 14, and 15 for hearing dates, beginning at 8:30 A.M. each day. Cecelia will send forms to department heads to prepare their departmental budget requests.

The committee discussed placing the audit out for bid annually, which was previously decided. Chairman Jim Meyer will meet with Cecelia to get the information ready to advertise for bids in September.

Your committee to whom was referred **Planning and Zoning** would beg leave to submit the following report on the matters before them:

Your committee met at the Administrative Center on July 3, 2008, at 1:00 P.M. Members present were Merle Lemenager, Donna Wasmer, Troy Krumwiede, Beryl Luecke, Donna Crow, Dale Schultz and Jim Meyer. Also present were Gloria Schleef, Zoning Administrator; Debbie Wright, Chief Deputy Zoning Administrator; Jim Devine, State's Attorney; and Wendy Davis from the *Times-Republic*.

Gloria Schleef, Zoning Administrator, contacted the individuals that were recommended to fill the vacant position on the Regional Planning Commission. Rob Shrimplin from the Sheldon area was one of the candidates under consideration and was very interested in filling the position. After a brief discussion, a motion was made by Dale Schultz and seconded to appoint Rob Shrimplin to the vacant position on the Regional Planning Commission. Motion carried.

Gloria spoke of the wind tower seminar that she attended and provided a handout that was prepared by a law firm that specializes in wind tower law. She was informed that Illinois has a higher tax on wind towers than most other states. She also learned that parcels which contain a wind tower could be zoned as enterprise zones which in turn would attract developers because it provides tax exemptions on their equipment. Additionally, it was noted that Vision Energy will be present August 5<sup>th</sup> to discuss the creation of a wind farm in Milks Grove Township. If everything goes as planned they may be ready for hearings as early as the end of August. Gloria said that because of the amount of time needed to transcribe the minutes of the hearings for the wind towers, it would be beneficial to hire a court stenographer for faster access to the minutes.

Gloria also reported on the following:

- After being reviewed, the ordinance revisions are ready for a public hearing.
- There was only one single family house permit issued this month.
- Ron Fuller will be requesting a conditional use to add a building for a dog confinement food testing facility.
- The sign off that is required by the Health Department before work can proceed on new plumbing and septic has been taking longer than anticipated. It is hoped that as more requests are made the process will become more efficient.

The committee discussed insurance coverage for Zoning Board of Appeals members. State's Attorney Jim Devine suggested an umbrella policy if an insurance policy cannot be found to cover individual suits. Committee member Jim Meyer said that after looking into different types of insurance, most umbrella policies do not cover public acts therefore coverage is not guaranteed. The committee agreed that more research is needed before a decision is made regarding the insurance coverage.

A public meeting was called to order for the purpose of hearing one final plat request and one conditional use request.

Shellie Billingsley is requesting a final plat approval for Twin Oaks, a two-lot subdivision in Belmont Township. Attorney Pat Murphy spoke on behalf of Ms. Billingsley. At the last meeting, the committee recommended that a shed needed to be torn down before the final plat was presented. Mr. Murphy attested that the building had been removed. He also noted that two concrete pads from old silos or grain bins will also be removed. Since there is no well or septic on one of the lots in the proposed subdivision, the Health Department will have to sign off on one of the lots. Regional Planning unanimously approved the final plat. Following further discussion, a motion was made by Beryl Luecke and seconded to **approve** the final plat under the condition that a building permit will not be issued until the Health Department has signed off. Roll call vote. Motion to **approve** carried unanimously.

Mindy Kuntz Hagen told the committee that she and her husband would like to replace the homestead at her husband's family farm in Concord Township. She is requesting a Conditional Use to replace the home. The Zoning Board of Appeals approved the request unanimously. A motion was made by Jim Meyer and seconded to **approve** the Conditional Use request to replace the home. Roll call vote. Motion to **approve** carried unanimously.

The committee reviewed claims. It was moved by Dale Schultz and seconded to pay bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Beryl Luecke and seconded to adjourn at 2:24 P.M. Motion carried.

Your committee to whom was referred **Policy & Procedure** would beg leave to submit the following report on the matters before them:

Your committee met at the Administrative Center on July 7, 2008 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Ron Schroeder, John Wilkening, Jerry Haynes, John Kuntz, Harriett Mowrey, Merle Lemenager, Donna Wasmer, and Jim Meyer. Also present were Mindy Kuntz Hagan, Treasurer; Tom Tuntland, Director of County Information Systems; Bob Yergler, Supervisor of Assessments; Cecelia Dixon, Director of Data Processing; Mark Henrichs, County Clerk; Joel Moore, County Engineer; Barb Witte, Administrative Assistant to the County Board; Gloria Schleef, Zoning Administrator; Jim Devine, State's Attorney; Carl Gerdovich, ESDA Coordinator; and Wendy Davis from the *Times-Republic*.

Chairman Schroeder reported the IRS mileage reimbursement rate has increased to 58.5 cents per mile. This rate is effective July 1, 2008 through December 31, 2008.

Ron said a meeting has been requested by a company interested in an area in Milks Grove Township as a possible site for wind energy towers. The meeting, which will be discussion only at this point, is scheduled for August 5<sup>th</sup> and will include Ron, John Wilkening, Merle Lemenager, the chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals and the Regional Planning Commission, and representatives from the wind energy company.

Director of Data Processing Cecelia Dixon said a new line item is needed for a reimbursement that the Sheriff's Department receives from the State. The State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP) reimbursement, which is applied for annually, can be used for salary and overtime for Correctional Officers only. State's Attorney Jim Devine said he will prepare a resolution to create the new line item.

County Clerk Mark Henrichs said he has received suggestions for questions to include on the County Fair public opinion poll from Representative Tim Johnson and Senator Gary Dahl. Mark invited County Board members to submit any ideas they may have for additional questions. Mark noted that the County's previous election vendor set up and printed the ballots at no cost for the County Fair opinion poll. Because the new vendor charges for this service, Mark said his office now sets up and prints "regular" paper ballots in-house.

Each committee chairman highlighted their report and answered questions.

Discussion was held concerning the County School Facility Occupation Tax. Superintendents were present from six of the eight schools which have approved resolutions to place the tax question on the November ballot. Board members questioned what would happen if the County Board did not approve putting the question on the ballot. State's Attorney Jim Devine was advised that the Board does vote on the issue, but regardless of the outcome of the vote, they must certify the question of imposing the tax to the proper election authority. According to the public act, the schools have the

power to authorize the County to do so. This does not reflect the County Board's opinion of the tax or an endorsement of it. It was also noted if the referendum is approved, the County Board can at a later date, lower or eliminate the tax by additional referendum if it is found to be no longer needed or excessive. Following further discussion, it was moved by Jim Meyer and seconded to approve the School Boards' resolutions requesting the County Board of the County of Iroquois, Illinois, to certify to the County Clerk of said County the question of imposing a 1% sales tax for school facility purposes for submission to the electors of said County at the general election to be held on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2008. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by John Kuntz and seconded to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Jerry Haynes and seconded to adjourn at 10:43 A.M. Roll call vote. Motion carried.
