Your Committee to whom was referred **Management Services** would beg leave to submit the following report on the matters before them:

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on October 3, 2006, at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Harriett Mowrey, Dennis Johnson, Jean Hiles, Lowell Schmidt, and Merle Lemenager. Also present were Larry Pankey, Maintenance Supervisor; Sheriff Eldon Sprau; Bill Donahue, Assistant State's Attorney; Ron Schroeder, County Board Chairman; John Wilkening, County Board Vice Chairman; and County Board member John Dowling,.

Assistant State's Attorney Bill Donahue conducted the bidding process for leasing out approximately 391 acres of County-owned farmland, also known as the "County Farm". "Walker Place" currently possesses the original lease which will expire on February 28, 2007. A total amount of six bids were received in writing, with the highest original bid going to "Walker Place," at \$165.00 per acre. All persons in attendance representing the five out of six submitted written bids were allowed to verbally continue with the bidding process. "Walker Place" was the highest bidder with \$173.00 per acre.

It was moved by Dennis Johnson and seconded to accept the bid from "Walker Place" for a three year lease. Motion carried.

Sheriff Eldon Sprau reported the proposed visitation room is coming along very well. Goodman Electronics will be running tests on all of the equipment installed to make sure no glitches are found. Sheriff Sprau also expressed gratitude to the Maintenance Department for all of their work on the project. He also invited board members to view the visitation area and see the work that has been completed.

Maintenance Supervisor Larry Pankey reported the City of Watseka inspected a manhole near the Courthouse. The manhole was filled with garbage, which had gone through the sewer system at the County Jail.

Both Sheriff Sprau and Larry spoke with the City of Watseka's Engineer. The manhole will have to be jetted out to be cleaned. The engineer also suggested installing an injector pit, which is a grinder to chop up any garbage before it goes to the sewer. Larry stated the grinders are very high maintenance and very expensive, ranging in the vicinity of \$30,000 to \$40,000. Larry noted a more practical alternative would be to install a fiberglass tank similar to a large sump pump. The tank would then be pumped out every three months and would cost considerably less at a price range of

\$5,000 to \$7,000.

Maintenance will begin installing thermostat covers within two weeks. All department heads have received a letter regarding the covers.

The Committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Jean Hiles and seconded to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

Following the meeting, the Management members will be taking a tour of the new visitation area at the County Jail.

As there was no further business to come before the Committee, it was moved by Jean Hiles and seconded to adjourn at 10:43 A.M.

VANGUARD ENERGY SERVICES

Chris Landstrom, representative for Vanguard Energy Services, addressed the Board concerning the County's electrical service needs. Mr. Landstrom said Vanguard is currently contracted with the County to provide natural gas services. He said his company is also aligned with MidAmerica, and can provide their gas customers with electricity proposals as well.

Mr. Landstrom said as of January 1, 2007, the ten-year freeze on electric rates will be lifted and costs are expected to increase 25 to 30 percent at a minimum. He would like to offer the County proposals to lock into a specific rate before the increases begin. Mr. Landstrom said the Illinois House is debating a three-year extension on the freeze. He noted Ameren and ComEd have indicated an extension would have a disastrous effect on their companies. It was the consensus of the County Board to postpone locking in a rate until the Legislature has made a decision regarding the freeze extension.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on October 2, 2006 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were John Dowling, Betty Busick, Alan DeWitt, Jean Hiles, and Donna Wasmer. Also present were Dr. James Finnell, Animal Control Administrator; Alberta Burton, Director of Operations at the Iroquois Mental Health Center; Brian Martell, Solid Waste Coordinator; and Ron Schroeder, County Board Chairman.

Dr. Finnell distributed copies of the Animal Control Report for September 2006. There were a total of 14 stray dog calls, 6 bite cases, 1 registration violation, 6 welfare and nuisance calls, and 27 dogs impounded.

Dr. Finnell discussed several ongoing cases with the Committee involving dangerous dog declarations and violations. He explained to the Committee that from the standpoint of the law, a dog is declared dangerous if it attacks another animal or a person. He said if there are three separate dangerous dog declarations against one animal, the fourth declaration becomes a vicious dog declaration.

In other matters, Dr. Finnell said he thinks the Committee should seriously consider Dan Garner's request to be armed with a weapon when he is on high risk calls. He said some dogs are specifically trained to attack people and often there is more than one dog to contend with at once. Dr. Finnell has prepared a letter to be sent to States Attorney Jim Devine and Sheriff Eldon Sprau requesting their input on allowing Dan Garner to take the necessary training so he can carry a weapon when deemed necessary. The Committee read a copy of the letter.

In response to a question regarding cats running rampant in some areas, Dr. Finnell said the problem is not easily solved. He said the law does not provide for involvement of cat population control except for bites. He said people sometimes feed stray cats and they multiply very quickly. He said the only answer is responsible ownership. He said the Audubon Society is very concerned about the effect on birds.

Alberta Burton, Director of Operations at the Mental Health Center, spoke to the Committee. She passed out copies of the sliding scale fee schedule which went into effect on July 1, 2006. The fee schedule is based on annual family income and number of dependents in household. She said both the clients and employees at the Mental Health Center appreciate their new building and that it has helped boost morale significantly. She said summer is usually a less busy time, probably because people are outside more. She said persons can still get same day screening if they are in crisis. Alberta said Iroquois County has one of the highest suicide rates in the state.

Brian Martell, Solid Waste Coordinator, distributed copies of the Operating and Volume Report for the period ending September 30, 2006. Brian said he still does not have a glass market yet. He said there is a location where glass can be taken in Champaign, but he does not think it is recycled.

Brian went over the Expense and Revenue Report. He said interest is over the projected

amount for the year and he anticipates over 100% for revenue. He said no major repairs have been needed. He said the Recycling Center is open to the public Monday thru Friday from 9-3 and Saturday from 8-noon.

The Committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Donna Wasmer and seconded to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

As there was no further business to come before the Committee, a motion was made by Jean Hiles and seconded to adjourn at 10:00 A.M. Motion carried.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on October 3, 2006 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Jerry Haynes, John Kuntz, Kevin Hansen, Kathy Ebert, Alan Benjamin, Dale Schultz, and Jim Hurt. Also present were Tom Tuntland, County Programmer; Donna Schmitz and Cecelia Dixon, Data Processing; Mark Henrichs, County Clerk; Bob Yergler, Supervisor of

Assessments; Ron Schroeder, County Board Chairman; John Wilkening, County Board Vice-Chairman; and Marianne Hahn, President of the Friends of the Kankakee.

Director of Data Processing Donna Schmitz reported she has been working mainly on requested budget adjustments and various elements of the proposed FOP contract. Succeeding Director Cecelia Dixon said she is scheduled to attend an IMRF training session in Champaign next week; she and Donna will be traveling to Chicago this month as well, for meetings with the County's current insurance provider, BAS.

County Clerk Mark Henrichs reported on a new employee in his office, Breein Suver from Crescent City. Breein is currently training in the Recording Department and will have other duties as well.

Mark reported absentee voting began state-wide on September 28th. He said Iroquois County has not yet received their ballots from the election vendor, Fidlar.

Mark discussed changes which are taking place regarding workers' compensation. He reported he and his Chief Deputy Lisa Fancher attended a training session last week in Effingham, which was sponsored by Insurance Program Managers Group and ClaimsOne. Claims must now be submitted by his office electronically via the internet. All department heads will receive a new packet of forms and old forms should be destroyed. He said additionally, in an effort to reduce workers compensation costs to employers, a new prescription drug card program has been implemented effective immediately. Instructions concerning the drug card are included in the forms packet.

The Committee reviewed a resolution prepared by delinquent tax agent Dennis Ballinger. The resolution will transfer 17 parcels located in the Willow Estates area to the Friends of the Kankakee. The parcels have been obtained by the County through the delinquent tax process. The Friends of the Kankakee is a tax exempt conservation organization. They are willing to accept title to the properties subject to certain mutually agreed upon conditions and deed restrictions, as they have done in the past. It was moved by Kathy Ebert and seconded to approve the resolution transferring 17 parcels to the Friends of the Kankakee. Motion carried. The organization's President, Marianne Hahn, thanked the Committee for their consideration in adding this land to their existing nature preserve area.

County Programmer Tom Tuntland distributed his monthly report and answered questions. County Clerk Mark Henrichs said Tom has been working with his office to convert County Board minutes to a PDF file which can then be posted on the County's website. Tom said the minutes are now on the website from 2003 through July of this year. He said much of the County Clerk's yearbook is on the site as well and election results may also be posted.

Tom reported he is working on the Bulletin 810 program as it relates to drainage debasement and parcel splits in the Assessment Office. Supervisor of Assessments Bob Yergler discussed their work on determining how to divide the drainage assessment in cases of a split parcel. He said Springfield has indicated their approach is correct.

Bob reported all work is complete on the omitted parcels in Crescent and Ash Grove Townships. He reported the new EAV from the Crescent Township parcels will be approximately \$385,000 and the new EAV from the Ash Grove Township parcels will be approximately \$683,000. The numbers are not yet complete from the other townships in which omitted parcels were recently picked up.

The Committee discussed cell and radio tower, and windfarm assessments. It was decided

because a precedent may have already been set in regards to assessing towers, that further research is needed before proceeding.

The Committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Kathy Ebert and seconded to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

As there was no further business to come before the Committee, it was moved by Kevin Hansen and seconded to adjourn at 10:08 A.M. Motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. R2006-24

RESOLUTION TO TRANSFER CERTAIN TAX DELINQUENT LAND ACQUIRED BY IROQUOIS COUNTY TO THE FRIENDS OF THE KANKAKEE

WHEREAS, in the past several years, Iroquois County has acquired certain parcels of real estate through its tax delinquency sale performed annually at the Administrative Center; and

WHEREAS, certain number of those parcels acquired by Iroquois County lie near unique and natural open spaces that is sought by conservation organizations to be preserved as conservation and/or wildlife refuges; and

WHEREAS, Iroquois County desires that these uniquely situated properties be preserved for conservation purposes and as wildlife refuges and to be managed by appropriate conservation and wildlife organizations, and

WHEREAS, the Friends of the Kankakee (FOK), a tax exempt conservation organization, is willing to accept title to properties subject to certain mutually agreed upon conditions and deed restrictions;

- The transferred properties are to be maintained in perpetuity as natural open-space in keeping with the above-stated intent of Iroquois County and its citizens.
- The transferred properties to FOK may be subsequently transferred to the Illinois Department of Natural Resources or the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Refuge.
- The transferred properties to the FOK will revert back to Iroquois County

in the event that the FOK ceases to exist and another similar organization cannot be found to take ownership of the properties.

- The FOK shall pay all transaction costs, including the trustee fees of Iroquois County, associated with the property transfers to FOK.
- The subject property to be transferred consists of 17 parcels in the Willow Estates and Willow Estates First Addition subdivision in the northeastern corner of Iroquois County.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Iroquois County Board as follows:

That Iroquois County, through its trustee, is authorized to transfer 17 parcels of property in Willow Estates and the Willow Estates First Addition subdivisions to the Friends of the Kankakee, a tax exempt conservation organization, subject to the restrictions outlined in the paragraphs hereinbefore stated.

Your Committee to whom was referred **Judicial & Public Safety** would beg leave to submit the following report on the matters before them:

Your Committee met at the Courthouse on October 4, 2006, at 9:00 A.M. Members present were John Kuntz, Betty Busick, Alan DeWitt, Phyllis Jameson, John Wilkening, and Susan Wynn. Also present were Judge James Kinzer; Sheriff Eldon Sprau; Undersheriff Derek Hagen; Bill Cheatum, Coroner; Mike Power, Probation Supervisor; Carl Gerdovich, ESDA Coordinator; Arlene Hines, Circuit Clerk; Jim Devine, State's Attorney; and Ron Schroeder, County Board Chairman.

Judge James Kinzer reported on the improvement of services and communication with the Mental Health Center. Though it may not be up to schedule, improvements are being seen.

Judge Kinzer also reported on the number of DUI cases being tried. He explained once a person has received supervision for a DUI conviction, they cannot receive supervision again. It does not matter how long ago the previous offense occurred.

Committee member Susan Wynn requested the County Board consider granting \$40,000 for the funding of Pledge for Life, a program which was developed to teach alcohol and drug prevention to children at an age where they can better understand. Ms. Wynn would like consideration of the \$40,000 funding, saying it can be paid now, or paid later after these children are in the system.

Mike Power, Probation Supervisor, discussed obtaining a credit card for his department to pay for travel expenses, which in many situations are required to have payment up-front. Mike explained additionally, items are purchased through the department for children that are in need of basic toiletries. He said reimbursement at times can take up to 45 days, which can present a problem for credit card payments. The Committee discussed and will refer the issue to the Finance and Policy & Procedure Committees. Also discussed was the option of obtaining approval to have a claim paid before a regularly scheduled meeting and therefore payments could be made in a timely manner.

Mike also reported he would like to purchase a vehicle for his department. Currently, he has \$21,883 in his budget. The Committee discussed and will also refer this issue to the Finance and Policy & Procedure Committees. A decision should be made by next month's meeting.

State's Attorney Jim Devine reported on a standard annual resolution to appropriate \$11,000 for the State Appellate Prosecutor's office. The money is used for appeals sent from Iroquois County, which number from 10-15 annually. Jim also reported he will attend a death penalty conference later this week in Springfield, which will be paid if full by the State's Appellate

Prosecutor's office. A motion was made by John Wilkening and seconded to approve the annual resolution to appropriate \$11,000 for the State Appellate Prosecutor's Office. Motion carried.

Arlene Hines, Circuit Clerk, distributed her report for September 2006 and answered questions.

Sheriff Eldon Sprau reported the jail fee study is now complete. He reported on several findings from the study:

-Paper service fee- currently \$31; should be \$41.53.

-Bond out fee- currently \$13; should be \$13.90. The Sheriff is proposing a \$14 bond out fee.

-Book-in fee- currently there is none; should be \$25.93. The Sheriff is proposing a \$26 book-in fee.

Sheriff Sprau explained a resolution is needed to implement these fees, which could possibly generate as much as \$46,000 per year in additional revenue. A motion was made by John Wilkening and seconded to adopt a resolution for the proposed fee increases effective December 1, 2006, subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

Sheriff Sprau reported on the termination of an employee at the jail who has been replaced by Janelle Jaskula, a former employee. Also, Ryan Garfield is attending a five-week training course and is in his fourth week. Mark Lavoie has been off duty, due to an injury. He is expected to return sometime in November.

Sheriff Sprau reported his department has purchased three new 2006 Chevy Impalas. New light bars have been installed which are brighter and have no moving parts. Additionally, he reported the new remote visitation at the jail is complete except for counters. This will prevent people from entering the perimeter of the jail. Visitation for inmates is scheduled for every Tuesday and Saturday from 2 p.m. - 4 p.m.

Coroner Bill Cheatum distributed his report for September. There were 3 inquests, no inquests pending, 8 coroner's certificates issued, 13 coroner calls transferred to medical death certificates, and 3 cremation permits issued.

Bill reported on the death of a man who was living in Sheldon and working as a care-giver. Bill said the man has no family, but he was able to contact his attorney through some of the decedent's documents. He had used the attorney to become an American citizen years ago. It was found he had a large sum of money in an account, and after paying for funeral expenses as well as attorney fees, the county will be receiving the remaining sum once the estate has been settled.

ESDA Coordinator Carl Gerdovich distributed his report for the month of September. Carl highlighted his report and discussed various meetings he had attended. He thanked County Board members Jerry Haynes, John Kuntz, and John Wilkening for attending the I-EMA training exercise in Gilman on September 13, 2006. Several emergency responders participated, as well as 44 registered attendees.

Carl discussed the increase in school violence over the past week, noting several schools in Iroquois County are conducting drills. Carl said Dr. Kay Pangle, Regional Superintendent of Schools, has received a grant for \$496,000 to be used towards safety measures in everyday activities and mandates for schools.

For informational purposes only, Mark Henrichs, County Clerk reported on new workmans compensation procedures. He briefly explained the paperwork is needed in his office immediately following an accident.

WHEREAS, the powers and duties of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor are defined and enumerated in the "State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor's Act, 725 ILCS 210/1 et seq., as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois General Assembly appropriates monies for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate, one-third from the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor's County Fund and two-thirds from the General Revenue Fund, provided that such funding receives county approval and support from within the respective Judicial Districts eligible to apply; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor shall administer the operation of the appellate offices so as to insure that all participating State's Attorneys continue to have final authority in preparation, filing, and arguing of all appellate briefs and any trial assistance; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor and the Illinois General Assembly have reviewed and approved a budget for Fiscal Year 2007, which funds will provide for the continued operation of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Iroquois County Board, in regular session, this 10th day of October, 2006 does hereby support the continued operation of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor, and designates the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor as its Agent to administer the operation of the appellate offices and process said appellate court cases for this County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the attorneys employed by the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor are hereby authorized to act as Assistant State's Attorneys on behalf of the State's Attorneys of this County in the appeal of all cases, when requested to do so by the State's Attorney, and with the advice and consent of the State's Attorney prepare, file, and argue appellate briefs for those cases; and also, as may be requested by the State's Attorney, to assist in the prosecution of cases under the Illinois Controlled Substances Act, the Cannabis Control Act, the Drug Asset Forfeiture Procedure Act and the Narcotics Profit Forfeiture Act. Such attorneys are further authorized to assist the State's Attorney in the State's Attorney's duties under the Illinois Public Labor Relations Act, including negotiations thereunder, as well as in the trial and appeal of tax objections.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the attorneys employed by the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor may also assist the State's Attorney of this County in the discharge of the State's Attorney's duties in the prosecution and trial of other cases, and may act as Special Prosecutor if duly appointed to do so by a court having jurisdiction.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Iroquois County Board hereby agrees to participate in the service program of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor for Fiscal Year 2007, commencing December 1, 2006, and ending November 30, 2007, by hereby appropriating the sum of \$11,000 as consideration for the express purpose of providing a portion of the funds required for financing the operation of the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor, and agrees to deliver the same to the Office of the State's Attorneys Appellate Prosecutor on request during the Fiscal Year 2007.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on October 5, 2006 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Lowell Schmidt, Russell Bills, Jerry Haynes, John Dowling, Susan Wynn, and Phyllis Jameson. Also present were Roger Schuldt, Schuldt Insurance; Donna Schmitz and Cecelia Dixon, Data Processing; Mark Henrichs, County Clerk; Ron Schroeder, County Board Chairman; John Wilkening, County Board Vice-Chairman; and Erin Doss from the *Times-Republic*.

Roger Schuldt, Schuldt Insurance, reported on September 13th a lawn mower for the Highway Department was added to the County's insurance policy and on September 22nd, three 2006 Chevy squad cars were added.

The Committee briefly discussed insurance coverage for county vehicles. Including trailers, snowplows, etc, there are approximately 65 vehicles insured by the County. Insurance Chairman Jerry Haynes said he will review the level of coverage to see where adjustments can be made. Concerning the request for a Probation Department vehicle, it was the consensus of the Committee that other County vehicles can be made available to them.

The Committee discussed the various agencies requesting funding from the County budget. They noted all are worthy and deserving programs; it is just not possible to fund them all at the level they request.

The Committee reviewed the proposed budget. Extensive discussion was held concerning recommended salary increases. Some committee members and elected officials expressed concern that some of the recommended increases were substantially larger than others. They stressed their opposition is not about the individuals or their capabilities; just that it is hard to justify such large increases while EAV continues to decrease in Iroquois County. The proposed increase for Solid Waste Coordinator Brian Martell is \$6,500; from \$40,250 to \$46,750. The proposed increase for County Programmer Tom Tuntland is \$5,000 from \$40,000 to \$45,000. Following discussion, it was moved by Russell Bills and seconded to recommend increasing the salary for Brian Martell and Tom Tuntland to \$43,200. Roll call vote. Russell Bills: Aye; Jerry Haynes: Nay; John Dowling: Aye; Susan Wynn: Aye; Phyllis Jameson: Aye. Motion carried.

The Committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by John Dowling and seconded to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

County Board Vice-Chairman John Wilkening reported the FOP Sergeants and Lieutenants have reportedly ratified their contract; however, the County has not received it. He said there is a possible problem with the language. John reported AFSCME wants to delay negotiations until they know what the health insurance proposal from the County will be. Finance Chairman Lowell Schmidt said the County's cost for health insurance exceeds \$6,000 per year, per employee. Based on this, the insurance proposal is a \$20 per month employee contribution for individual insurance for employees that participate in the wellness program; \$30 per month for those who elect not to participate. Additionally, the employee will be charged for the difference in cost between a generic and a brand name drug when the generic is available.

Chairman Schmidt said additionally, he would like to see an overall reduction in overtime by 20% or more if possible in all offices, which would save as much as \$20,000 per year. He asked also, that all offices that have not made their transfers to the general fund please do so by October 13th.

Lowell reported the proposed 06/07 budget shows a \$1,100 surplus. It was moved by John Dowling and seconded to recommend the proposed budget, as amended today, to the full County Board. Roll call vote. Motion carried unanimously. The budget must be on display for thirty days in the County Clerk's Office prior to final approval in November.

County Clerk Mark Henrichs reported ballots have still not been delivered. He said for the future, he is researching printing ballots in-house.

As there was no further business to come before the Committee, it was moved by Susan Wynn and seconded to adjourn at 10:43 A.M. Motion carried.
