She told the Board that Terragen has stepped away from the Prairie Green Horseshoe Wind Farm project and has sent letters to all landowners in that area of their intent.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on October 27, 2011 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Donna Wasmer, Don Deany, Dale Schultz, Adam Zumwalt, Troy Krumwiede, Jim Meyer, Merle Lemenager, and Dan Pursley. Also present were Zoning Administrator Gloria Schleef and Assistant Zoning Administrator Debbie Wright. Also in attendance were Jean Hiles, John Shure, Kermit Wasmer, Betty Thompson, Marvin Stichnoth, Joel Moore, Carolyn Graham, Delmar Graham, Theta Lee, Rod Copas, Jed Whitlow, State's Attorney Jim Devine, and Wendy Davis from the Times Republic.

Ms. Wasmer said the Decommissioning Plan was reviewed last month and most of the Committee was in favor. Everyone has a copy of the proposed Decommissioning along with some suggested changes.

Mr. Devine said he was trying to limit the Board's input on the road agreement. He stated the road authorities should do their job. He gave copies of an updated Decommissioning Plan to the Committee. A copy of this proposed Decommissioning Plan and the suggested changes are attached.

Highway Commissioner Joel Moore discussed the decommissioning for the existing wind farms of Settlers Trail and Pioneer Trail. He said K4 is moving forward again as he had a meeting with them yesterday. Mr. Zumwalt questioned on what would happen if the company wasn't in existence thirty years down the road. Mr. Devine said there would still be the local authority to keep heavy equipment off the road until there was an agreement. He said there will be an appropriate plan approved by the County Engineer; they will have the most knowledge of what is needed.

After review, Mr. Schultz made a motion to approve the proposed Decommissioning Plan and the suggested changes. Mr. Deany seconded the motion.

There was general discussion on the amount of the decommissioning already in the Wind Ordinance.

A roll call was taken. Voting "aye" were Don Deany, Merle Lemeanger, James Meyer, Dan Pursley, Dale Schultz, and Donna Wasmer. Voting "nay" were Troy Krumwiede and Adam Zumwalt. Motion to approve carried.

The moratorium, which will expire November 8, 2011, was discussed. Mr. Zumwalt said the approved changes are not law so the moratorium cannot be lifted.

Mr. Meyer made a motion to extend the moratorium until December 13, 2011. Mr. Zumwalt seconded the motion.

A roll call was taken. Voting "aye" were Troy Krumwiede, Merle Lemenager, James Meyer, Dan Pursley, Dale Schultz, Adam Zumwalt, and Donna Wasmer. Voting "nay" was Don Deany. Motion to approve carried.

Ms. Schleef said the only other item for the regular Planning & Zoning Committee meeting would be the claims and only two claims had been turned in. She said the claims had not been put on the agenda for this meeting. Mr. Meyer said the claims could not be approved at this meeting but they could be brought to the Finance meeting. It was the consensus of the Committee that claims could be taken to the Finance meeting and the regular Planning & Zoning Committee meeting could be canceled.

Mr. Zumwalt made a motion to adjourn the meeting, which was seconded by Mr. Pursley. The meeting was adjourned at 9:35 A.M.

Section J, subparagraphs 2.h. of the Iroquois County Wind Energy Ordinance requires financial assurance of the wind company for "any damage to the roads caused by constructing, operating or maintaining the WECS." To this section we can add the words "and decommissioning security including but not limited to financial security provisions if the applicant, owner, or operator and/or successors are no longer doing business in this County or the project is abandoned."

For me to add special language to the decommissioning section when this is already addressed is adding words for the sake of adding words. Other specific details needed by the local road authorities should be addressed by them in their separate road agreements.

XI. Decommissioning Plan

Prior to receiving the issuance of a building permit under this Ordinance, the County, the Applicant or Owner, and/or Operator (Applicant) must agree to a Decommissioning Plan that ensures the WECS Project is properly decommissioned. The Decommissioning Plan shall include:

- A. Provisions describing the triggering events for decommissioning the WECS Project which shall include but not be limited to any wind turbine generator or anemometer tower that is not generating electricity for a continuous period of twelve months.
- B. Removal of all transmission equipment, buildings and fences.
- C. Removal of all structures, debris and cabling and all physical material pertaining to the project improvements to a depth of 48" beneath the soil surface.
- Provisions for the restoration of the soil surface to the same condition that existed immediately before construction of such improvements.
- E. Financial assurances to Iroquois County to include:
 - A licensed Illinois professional engineer's cost estimate for demolition and removal of the WECS facility.
 - b. Financial assurance in an amount at least equal to said demolition and removal cost estimate and road repair estimate, with consideration of salvage value, through the use of a bond, letter of credit or other financial security acceptable to the County. Said security shall be released when each tower site and road repairs are properly decommissioned as determined by the Iroquois County Zoning Administrator, public road authority or other proper County official.
 - c. The licensed Illinois professional engineer, selected by Iroquois County, shall provide the original decommissioning cost estimate prior to the issuance of the building permit and a new cost estimate, with consideration of salvage value, shall be prepared every three years. The engineer's fee shall be paid by the Applicant. Financial assurances to the County shall be adjusted every three years to reflect new cost estimates prepared by the engineer.
 - d. In the event of abandonment of the project, the Applicant shall provide an affidavit to the Iroquois County Zoning Administrator representing that all easements for wind turbines shall contain terms that provide financial assurance, including access to the salvage value of the equipment, and for the property owners to ensure that the WECS and related improvements are properly decommissioned within twelve months of abandonment or earlier termination of the wind project.
 - e. A provision that the terms of the Decommissioning Plan shall be binding upon the Applicant and any of their successors, assigns, or heirs.
- F. The County may sell any salvageable material to reduce the County's expenses related to the decommissioning of any project site and shall be granted access to each site to effect or complete decommissioning.
- G. In the event of project abandonment, the County reserves the right to remove the towers and access any related salvageable materials for the County to sell but the County is not obligated to remove the concrete improvements which provide the structural base for the towers.

Your committee met at the Administrative Center on October 31, 2011 at 4:00 P.M. Members present were Jim McCray, Kyle Anderson, Donna Wasmer, Jean Hiles, Adam Zumwalt, Ozzie Storm, and John Wilkening. Also present Maintenance Supervisor Larry Pankey, IDA Director Ken Barragree, 911 Director Nita Dubble, representative from Ruder Technology, Kankakee, IL, ESDA Director Carl Gerdovich, County Information Systems Director Tom Tuntland, and W

endy Davis from the Times Republic.

Trent Sterrenberg from Trent's Lawn Care Services, Watseka, IL, and members of the committee have walked around the County buildings to clarify what the County expects in fulfilling the snow removal contract. A snow removal guideline will be prepared.

Chairman McCray said David Hubert, Management Services Committee member, has been in contact with the Soil & Water Conservation Office inquiring how the County could prevent further erosion on the County's farmland south of the former Green Acres building. A waterway may be the answer. Discussion will continue at the December meeting.

911 Director Nita Dubble introduced Jeff from Ruder Communications, Kankakee, Il to give an overview of how the County's telephone system could be improved. One major inability of County offices is calling between offices without incurring a cost from A T & T. Call One, a second party vendor who buys telephone services in bundles, had contacted Chairman McCray interested in providing its services and savings of approximately 14%. Before the County would commit to their service, an outside contractor, Ruder Communications, was asked to do a survey of the functions for all County telephones and present a plan to the committee. An overall 4-year

payback of the cost could be possible and would upgrade the system. All new wires in the Administrative Center, either one for phones or two for phones and computers would be run for the 2 closets, re-wiring and purchase of hardware for Jail, Couthouse and Administrative Center. The next direction the committee will pursue would be to ask State's Attorney Devine if the County has to bid with the cost being over \$30,000.00. After further discussion, it was moved by John Wilkening and seconded by Ozzie Storm to pursue upgrading the telephone system including running 2 wirings at the Administrative Center. Roll Call vote. Anderson, aye; Storm, aye; Wasmer, aye; Wilkening, aye; Zumwalt, aye; Hiles, aye; McCray, aye. Motion carried.

IDA Director Ken Barragree, Brian Grimes from B & D Electric, Gordon Electric, Kankakee, IL and Maintenance Supervisor Larry Pankey have been exploring a grant from Ameren to update pumps costing \$22,904. The grant would fund a maximum of 75% of the cost and also cut energy cost by 50% by reducing the horsepower of the new pumps. The County's cost would be between \$5,000 and \$7,000. It was moved by Jean Hiles and Donna Wasmer to authorize the writing the grant. Roll call vote. Storm, aye; Wasmer, aye; Wilkening, aye; Zumwalt, aye; Hiles, aye; McCray, aye; Anderson, aye. Motion carried.

Maintenance Supervisor Larry Pankey reported:

*Air-conditioner project took 4 days to complete replacing antiquated expansion values and motherboard on the chiller. State's Attorney Devine was contacted and said the expenses could be taken from the Capital Improvement fund since it will increase the efficiency of the system. The parts cost \$7,760. Trane and Glade assisted with the installation.

*The 911 entrance on the south side of the Administrative Center awning costing between \$700 and \$800 needs to be replaced. It was moved by Jean Hiles and seconded by John Wilkening to authorize Maintenance Supervisor Larry Pankey spend up to \$1,000 to replace the awning, the frame is still good. Roll Call vote. Wasmer, aye; Wilkening, aye; Zumwalt, aye; Hiles, aye; McCray, aye; Anderson, aye; Storm, aye. Motion carried.

*The committee was reminded by Maintenance Supervisor Larry Pankey that the County has a deadline of November 18, 2011 to respond to the Department of Labor concerning County violations. State's Attorney Devine was asked to respond.

The remainder of the meeting was in discussion of the possibility of expanding the present landfill and its options. The Tax committee had referred the issue to this committee for discussion. Since the committee had little information, it was suggested Ken Barragree and committee members obtain information. It was moved by Ozzie Storm and seconded by Jean Hiles to explore (ONLY) a landfill, and gather more information. Motion carried. Anderson voted nay.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Ozzie Storm and seconded by Jean Hiles to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

The meeting was called to order.

The committee reviewed the claims listing. It was moved by Ernest Curtis and seconded by Bret Schmid to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried.

Management Services Committee member Jean Hiles updated the committee on what her committee had discussed concerning expanding the current landfills. The committee will continue to investigate.

County Information Systems Director Tom Tuntland reported on the status of the Sage accounting software implementation project. Mr. Tuntland said it is moving along with some problems, but most have been resolved. November 10th is a target date set for approval of Chart of Accounts and the payroll processing training will begin December 7th, 2011. Due to the issue

with the County's current payroll system, it was decided not to convert and import payroll information into MIP for the calendar year ending December 31, 2011. The 2011 W-2's will not be produced out of MIP. Mr. Tuntland said Sage is working on reviewing the database to determine the cause of the difference appearing in the MIP bank reconciliation module for the main bank account. Training has been a big issue.

Animal Control Administrator Dr. Finnell reported Animal Control Warden Dan Garner received information from J. Ackerman, Inspector for the Illinois Department of Animal Welfare that the Department, was downsizing by not replacing a retiring receptionist and firing four (4) inspectors. The remaining inspectors must cover the entire state and will not take livestock cases and they will only be able to check on licenses. Dr. Finnell also said the Department of Conservation was doing likewise, instead of having one game warden for each county, there will be one for every three (3) counties.

Supervisor of Assessments Bob Yergler said he is watching the veto session closely on legislation to create a law where the County can file a lien on property if the owner of several residences has applied for than one homestead exemption.

County Clerk Lisa Fancher said her office is working on updating the Iroquois County Code Book. The expense will be of \$11,000 to \$15,000 and will be taken from the Recorder's Automation Fund.

County Clerk Fancher said the office has received an application for a 2 A.M. liquor license from Peggy Vest, Claytonville, IL who has purchased the bar in Bryce, IL. County liquor licenses are not transferable. All necessary background checks are done. Ms. Vest will pay a 6 month license fee. It was moved by Jim Hurt and seconded by Merle Lemenager to approve the application request and move to the Liquor License Commissioner for signature. Motion carried.

County Treasurer Mindy Kuntz Hagan reported she is monitoring a law passed mandating during next year's County tax sale it shall be video taped or computerized. Ms. Hagan said she would do it the most economical way possible.

Tax Chairman Dale Schultz explained the procedure he used to prepare and calculate the color coded 2011/2012 Iroquois County levy worksheet which was distributed to all members present to review. The EAV estimate is \$455 million and would be the County's maximum request. The corporate fund on the levy is the only fund that goes directly to the General Fund. The zero rate funds are levied for what is needed. After answering questions from committee members, it was moved by Dan Pursley and seconded by Jed Whitlow to forward to the County Board for review in preparation of passing an Ordinance in December of a 2011 levy of \$4,852,300.00 based on an EAV of \$455 million with a 20% cut in the zero rate funds. Roll call vote. Pursley, aye; Curtis, aye; Whitlow, aye; Hurt, aye; Lemenager, aye; Krumwiede, aye; Schmid, aye; Schultz, aye. Motion carried.

Your Committee met at the Courthouse on November 2, 2011 at 3:00 P.M. Members present were Susan Wynn Bence, Jed Whitlow, Rod Copas, and Jean Hiles. Also present State's Attorney Jim Devine, Coroner Bill Cheatum, ESDA Director Carl Gerdovich, and Wendy Davis from the Times Republic.

The meeting was called to order.

State's Attorney Jim Devine said he would be sending a collective response to the Illinois Department of Labor regarding County violations. The deadline to respond is November 18th, 2011.

Circuit Clerk Lisa Hines was not present. Ms. Hines was preparing for Grand Jury tomorrow.

ESDA Director Carl Gerdovich reported he has received final approval from ILEAS of the Iroquois County ESDA's EOC Technology Grant. The total compensation and reimbursement payable is for \$10,789.96 for the period from the date of the execution of the agreement through March 31, 2012. The grant utilizes funds from the Department of Homeland Security through the Illinois Law Enforcement Alarm System (ILEAS). The equipment to be purchased includes monitors, laptops, etc. The County will cut the check and submit invoices to ILEAS for reimbursement.

ESDA Director Gerdovich said the County Highway Department has repaired the 1998 s-10 Chevrolet pickup used by ESDA.
