Each student has spent priceless time with our local experienced emergency personnel, which has helped them to understand the importance of safety and being prepared for an emergency.

There have been several instances when children who participated in Camp 911 were able to use the skills learned in real life situations. Here are just a few examples: A student was home alone and cut himself on a soup can lid and knew to call 911 for assistance. Several students saw a van with a suspicious subject in it and called out "Stranger Danger" and ran back into the school. The knowledge gained from previous Camps also enabled students to properly assist their family during a house fire and in yet another incident a student was able to prevent her grandfather from choking and actually saved his life!
