PUBLIC COMMENTS

County Board member Larry Hasbargen spoke about his opposition to the Public Comment Policy that will be presented to the Board later in the meeting. He feels it is important to hear the concerns of the public and disrespectful to limit the time and their ability to voice those concerns.

OUTSIDE ORGANIZATION REPORTS

IEDA Director Ken Barragree talked to the Board about Lyon Metal of Watseka, which is continuing to grow and is moving more production into Watseka all the time. They expressed the need to hire approximately 60 more employees; however, they have decided to wait until early next spring which begins their busy season.

Ken also talked about QSE, also of Watseka, and their dilemma on whether or not they will reopen a facility in Watseka. Their current facility was closed due to the most recent flood.

Lastly, he spoke about the commissary which was planned as part of the Berkot’s grocery store in Watseka. This area would be used as a processing plant to make and package homemade sausages and meats which would then be sold in their stores. Because the building code adopted by the City of Watseka is too restrictive and there really is no way to appeal, Berkot’s will not move forward with the project at their Watseka location. Ken will continue to work with the City of Watseka and Berkot’s to try to keep the additional 15-20 jobs that the commissary would bring, local.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on August 28, 2015 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were County Board Chairman Kyle Anderson, Dan Rayman, Kevin Hansen, Russell Bills, John Shure, Dale Schultz, and Lyle Behrends. Troy Krumwiede was absent. Also present County Clerk Lisa Fancher, Treasurer Mindy Kuntz Hagan, Finance Director Anita

Speckman, Supervisor of Assessments Bob Yergler, 911 Director Nita Dubble, County Engineer Joel Moore, ICPHD Administrator Dee Schippert, ESDA Director Eric Ceci, County Board members Charlie Alt, Donna Crow, Larry Hasbargen, and Jean Hiles, Iroquois County resident Marvin Stichnoth, Andrew Garrett with Garrett Discovery, Will Brumleve with the Paxton Record, and Carla Waters with the Times Republic.

The meeting was called to order.

There were no public comments.

The Committee Chairs gave their monthly reports.

- Highway Chairman Russell Bills will be receiving quotes for pipes at the Highway Department.
- Planning & Zoning Chairman Dan Rayman will continue to discuss the enforcement of ordinances with his committee. There will also be a discussion on the nuisance ordinance and kennel ordinance. Rayman also noted Ed and Linda Hanson will be present for the discussion and action regarding their request for a variance for the setback on 800 E in Clifton.
- Management Chairman Lyle Behrends reported the roof and parking lot projects are complete. The boiler project is almost complete. His committee will discuss the County Farm contract.
- Tax Chairman Dale Schultz will receive the normal reports, review Animal Control and discuss the levy.
- Judicial Chairman John Shure reported normal reports will be received and the committee will discuss hiring a public defender to reduce costs.
- Finance Chairman Kevin Hansen and his committee will discuss the FY16 budget.

ESDA Director Eric Ceci gave an update on the flooding situation in Iroquois County and talked about the types of assistance available to residents. Ceci also reported the LEPC will be holding a tabletop meeting on September 3rd.

County Board Chairman Kyle Anderson made the committee aware that newly appointed Board member, Dan Joyce, will be assigned to his respective committees at the County Board meeting on September 8th.

The committee discussed the public comment parameters that were reviewed at the previous meeting. It was moved by Hansen and seconded by Rayman to send the public comment parameters to the County Board for approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

Anderson announced the AFSCME contract has been recorded at the County Clerk's office and the unfair labor practice suit has dropped as well.

Andrew Garrett with Garrett Discovery presented information pertaining to the forensic audit of 17 computers from Ford Iroquois Public Health Department. He began by providing a brief history, stating the audit started in 2014 at the request of former County Board Chairman Rod Copas. The initial audit was done free of charge by Garrett Discovery. Because of those findings, a full forensic audit was requested. Mr. Garrett said there were findings of file carving, file wiping (which is a term used to "wipe your tracks" after you've been using the internet), purchasing concert tickets and running a personal business. A snapshot summary was provided with the number of websites running in incognito mode, the number of posts to Facebook during work hours and the number of posts to dating sites as well. Mr. Garrett also provided a report for each user and their history. He estimated 2,700 hours per year towards personal usage.

Under new business, the November 2016 County Board meeting falls on General Election Day which is a state holiday in which offices are closed, with the exception of the County Clerk. Anderson asked the committee which day they would like to reschedule the meeting for. The committee agreed to reschedule the County Board meeting for Wednesday, November 9, 2016.

Schultz asked for the next steps upon receiving the forensic audit information from Garrett Discovery. Anderson answered the information will be forwarded to State's Attorney Jim Devine.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Shure and seconded by Rayman to adjourn at 9:33 A.M.

PUBLIC COMMENT POLICY

The Iroquois County Board encourages input from the public. The purpose of this policy is to ensure that citizens are allowed time to present their views pertaining to issues concerning Iroquois County while permitting the County Board to conduct their meetings in an effective manner.

1. Public comments shall be limited to five minutes per person unless the chairman grants additional time as needed and within reasonable time limits. The total time limit for public comments is thirty minutes unless extended by the chairman.
2. The chairman may deny a citizen's request to speak if the individual has addressed the Board on the same subject within the past two months.
3. If a group with similar views on an issue wishes to speak during public comment period the Board asks that a spokesperson be selected to address the Board. Redundancy and repetition does not facilitate an orderly and efficient meeting.
4. Public comments are strongly encouraged to cover topics related to the agenda of the Iroquois County Board and may include old business items not currently before the Board.
5. The public comment time is not a question and answer session and Board members are not obligated to respond to any comments or questions. Citizens

who wish to speak with individual Board members are encouraged to directly contact Board members before or after an open meeting to discuss Board issues.

6. Citizens making public comments shall respect the privilege and refrain from the use of inappropriate language, innuendos, or other offensive actions or gestures.
7. Public Comments is not a forum to be used by political candidates to advance their candidacy for any public office.

Your Committee to whom was referred **Finance** would beg leave to submit the following report on the matters before them:

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on August 27, 2015 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were Kevin Hansen, Bret Schmid, Charlie Alt, Russell Bills, and Ernie Curtis. Dan Rayman was absent. Also present County Board Chairman Kyle Anderson, Finance Director Anita Speckman, Treasurer Mindy Kuntz Hagan, County Clerk Lisa Fancher, Supervisor of Assessments Bob Yergler, 911 Director Nita Dubble, ICPHD Administrator Dee Schippert, and County Board members Larry Hasbargen and Jean Hiles.

The meeting was called to order.

County Board member Jean Hiles presented the budget for the Historical Society. She said it was decided to keep the budget numbers the same as the previous year. Hiles noted a separate account was opened for County money such as salaries and utilities. Hiles also told the committee the budget for the Museum is \$87,113.00 and she provided a copy to Finance Director Anita Speckman.

Speckman discussed the fiscal year 2016 budget with the committee and reminded them of the \$374,000 shortfall as of the last Finance budget hearing meeting. Since that meeting, County Board Chairman Kyle Anderson and Speckman have been working with all department heads to cover the shortfall. A spreadsheet was given to committee members with an overview of changes made. Beginning with revenue, Speckman explained they were able to increase revenue by 48%, adding an additional \$180,000 to the General Fund. This was made possible by asking for additional transfers from those elected officials who have automation funds, transfer from the Farm Fund, transfer from Probation Fees and ICPHD to cover items such as IT costs and increase the property tax estimate. Overall expenses were reduced by 52% or \$198,818.00 by looking at each line item with the corresponding department head. The Sheriff's request to purchase four squad cars was decreased to two squad cars, this is a savings of 25% or \$50,000.00. Speckman said eliminating or reducing all IT improvements results in a savings of \$21,002.00. There was duplication in the Animal Control clerk position and the Animal Control Director increase was eliminated resulting in a total savings of \$38,986.00. All non-union increases were reduced to 2% across the board. The outsourcing of snow removal was eliminated and is estimated to save approximately \$9,500.00. Speckman explained once all

revenues and expenses were reviewed, the shortfall was covered and the budget is \$287.00 to the positive.

Treasurer Mindy Kuntz Hagan gave a revenue update in regards to the Turnaround agenda. The handout she distributed stated the following:

- Local Government Distributive Fund and Personal Property Replacement Tax will continue to be distributed per the Office of the Comptroller.
- Payment of Motor Fuel Tax revenues for FY16 has not been approved per the Illinois Department of Transportation.
- Video gaming revenues will also be withheld from municipalities that allow gaming until monies are appropriated in the state budget.
- Payment of salary reimbursement have been suspended for the State's Attorneys, Public Defenders and Supervisor of Assessments salary reimbursements going forward until an appropriation for the 2016 fiscal year is established. Payments for Supervisors of Assessments half salary reimbursements are suspended beginning with the June 2015 payments and the State's Attorneys and Public Defenders salary reimbursements payments are suspended beginning with the July 2015 payments.
- The Illinois Commerce Commission has notified 911 authorities that they will receive one remaining payment from FY15 on or about August 18, 2015. Payment of FY2016 revenues will require appropriation authority granted in a state budget for that purpose.

Finance Chairman Kevin Hansen spoke about the number of employees that have retired recently and have not been replaced. He said at some point this cannot continue and when other employees retire, their jobs will need to be filled.

County Clerk Lisa Fancher made a cost savings suggestion to adjust the thermostats in the building by two degrees each night, on the weekends, and on holidays.

The committee discussed when to approve the budget. Speckman noted she is waiting on information from Iroquois County Public Health Department, 377 Board, and Mental Health Board. The budget cannot be approved without these items.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Charlie Alt and seconded by Russell Bills to adjourn at 9:35 A.M. Motion carried by a voice vote.

Randy Schuldt of Schuldt Insurance reported the only activity for the month is a claim turned in from the Highway Department for a backhoe.

Suzie Werner of Homestar Insurance Services thanked the committee for choosing to stay with Homestar as the County's insurance broker. Werner said she is currently working with Aflac on the benefits fair to be held November 12th and November 13th.

Alex Radu of Liberty National gave a presentation of the products and services Liberty National has to offer for County employees. These products include accidental death benefits, vision & hearing coverage and a critical illness policy, to name a few. These services are of no cost to the County, they are 100% paid for by the employee. Finance Director Anita Speckman noted these benefits are currently available to employees through Kansas City Life and Aflac at no cost, as well. She said the question is whether or not we want to offer Liberty National to employees in addition to what we already provide. Speckman also suggested inviting Liberty National to attend the County's benefits fair in November. The benefits fair will host all vendors and employees will get the opportunity to speak with a representative at that time. The committee agreed Liberty National should be in attendance at the County's benefits fair held in November.

The committee discussed the FY16 budget. Speckman stated she is working with Mental Health and also waiting on the farm contract. After discussion, it was moved by Russell Bills and seconded by Charlie Alt to post the proposed Fiscal Year 2016 budget on or before September 25, 2015. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

The Department Heads gave their monthly reports. They are as follows:

- Treasurer Mindy Kuntz Hagan reported the second installment of property taxes are due today, September 3rd.
- ICPHD Administrator Dee Schippert presented the FY2016 budget for the Iroquois County Public Health Department. The budget was approved by the Board of Health Wednesday, August 26th. Speckman questioned the pay increases for employees and the reasoning for a contingent fund and reserve fund. Schippert answered all employees will receive 2.5% increases, however, one employee will receive an approximate 17-18% increase. This employee is required to pass an LEHP test before receiving the budgeted increase. Schippert also has a part-time employee transitioning to full-time status. The reserve fund, Schippert said is to be used for unforeseen circumstances. Schippert reminded the committee of the \$10,000 she is funding for the IT fund compared to the \$5,000 she funded last year.

The committee reviewed claims. It was moved by Charlie Alt and seconded by Bret Schmid to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on August 31, 2015 at 9:00 A.M. Members present Lyle Behrends, Donna Crow, John Shure, Charlie Alt, and Larry Hasbargen. Adam Zumwalt was absent. Also present Maintenance Supervisors Larry Pankey and Clyde Meents, Finance Director Anita Speckman, and County Board members Jean Hiles and Dan Joyce.

The meeting was called to order.

There were no public comments.

Management Chairman Lyle Behrends reported no updates on the County Farm waterway.

He reminded the committee a meeting will be held on September 8th at 11:30 A.M. or immediately following the County Board meeting to open bids for the County Farm.

Behrends also spoke about the tiling issue and broken tile. He said this may be incorporated with the waterway issue. Maintenance Supervisor Larry Pankey noted the broken tile and tiling issue has been a problem for five to six years.

The Committee discussed the failing heatpump in the Public Health Department. Maintenance Supervisor Clyde Meents stated the heatpump has been running fine so far this month and he has been running a daily log on the activity as directed by the service technician. Behrends said each year monies are budgeted for the replacement of heatpumps. John Shure questioned whether or not the matter could be tabled until the next month but the matter has to be settled by November 30th. It was moved by Larry Hasbargen and seconded by Donna Crow to replace the heatpump in the Public Health Department. A roll call vote was taken. Crow, aye; Shure, aye; Alt, nay; Hasbargen, aye; Behrends, aye. Motion carried. The committee will accept sealed quotes and the project will not be bid out because the project is less than the amount required to put out for bids.

During the budget process, Behrends explained that it was decided not to outsource the snow removal this year. The cost savings should amount to approximately \$9,500 based on previous years' trends. Finance Director Anita Speckman stated they have spoken with Sheriff Derek Hagen and an amount will be agreed upon as far as what the Administrative Building will be funding towards snow removal.

Maintenance Supervisor Larry Pankey reported on the following:

- The utility pole is replaced behind the jail at no cost to the County.

Maintenance Supervisor Clyde Meents reported on the following:

- The roof project is complete.
- The parking lot is complete.
- The boiler is available to run but the entire project is not complete yet.
- Floor mats throughout the Administrative Building were recently cleaned by a local vendor.
- The Finance office is in the process of being painted.

The invoice for the remaining amount of the boiler project has been received and the committee discussed whether or not to pay the invoice in full or make a partial payment until the job is complete. It was moved by Shure and seconded by Charlie Alt to pay the claim to C&C

Plumbing & Heating, Inc. for the installation of the boiler in the Administrative Building, less 10% or \$8,795 due upon completion. A roll call vote was taken. Motion carried.

Behrends reviewed the FY16 capital improvements, which includes heatpumps for the Administrative Building, water lines for the Jail and touch up the paint for the exterior of the Administrative Building.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Alt and seconded by Shure to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried by a roll call vote.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Alt and seconded by Shure to adjourn the meeting at 9:58 A.M. Motion carried by a voice vote.

Coroner Bill Cheatum made the committee aware he would be purchasing a large volume of body bags with Kankakee County from a Coroners Grant. He said purchasing at such a large volume will result in a cost savings for both counties.

Probation Director Tom Latham reported the negotiations letter was received for the soon expiring FOP contract. Also, he is expecting a \$2,635 claim for detention but has not receiving the invoice and would like pre-approval to pay the claim. Judicial Chairman John Shure asked Latham to bring the invoice to the County Board meeting Tuesday, September 8th.
