Your Committee met at the Administrative Center on December 31, 2015 at 9:00 A.M. Members present were County Board Chairman Kyle Anderson, Dan Rayman, Russell Bills, John Shure, Dale Schultz, and Lyle Behrends. Kevin Hansen and Troy Krumwiede were absent. Also present County Clerk Lisa Fancher, Finance Director Anita Speckman, 911 Director Nita Dubble, Supervisor of Assessments Bob Yergler, Treasurer Mindy Kuntz Hagan, County Engineer Joel Moore, ICPHD Administrator Dee Schippert, ESDA Director Eric Ceci, County Board members Larry Hasbargen and Jean Hiles.

The meeting was called to order.

During public comments, County Board member Jean Hiles said she was contacted by the State Representative and the Senators Office about recycling and they were wondering if there were any funds available. Hiles said she believes there is a recycling fund but is unsure of the balance. Dale Schultz stated he was also contacted about the same matter and it is on the agenda for the Tax Committee. They are looking for funding to assist a program that is already in place.

The Committee Chairs gave their monthly reports.

- Highway Chairman Russell Bills stated the committee will review the monthly claims. Also, the annual spring MFT letting will be held in February.
- Planning & Zoning Chairman Dan Rayman will continue discussing ordinances with the committee.
- Management Chairman Lyle Behrends and the Management Committee will open fertilizer bids and discuss access to the soccer field.
- Tax Chairman Dale Schultz and the Tax Committee will review their regular monthly reports and discuss an electronic recycling program.
- Judicial Chairman John Shure reported normal reports will be received.
- The monthly I.T. Committee meeting has been cancelled.

ESDA Director Eric Ceci reported on the current flood situation. He said the shelter is open and is currently housing 17 residents. There is also a pet shelter available. The City of Watseka was declared a disaster yesterday. The Governor declared a state disaster, also. Ceci provided a copy of the Illinois Emergency Management Act for the committee to review. He also noted Iroquois County is a political subdivision and when the Mayor declares disaster, he is asking the County for help. Along with this, individual assistance is available for homes but not without a declaration. Ceci explained no motion is necessary for the declaration. The decision is solely up the County Board Chairman and a special County Board Meeting will need to be held to extend the declaration.

County Board Chairman Kyle Anderson declared disaster to help support the City of Watseka. A special County Board Meeting will be held on January 6th at 2:00 P.M.

Anderson stated he is still accepting names for the ETSB appointments. He received a letter from the City of Watseka with their recommendation.

The committee reviewed the Vacation Policy in the Personnel Manual. Anderson asked ICPHD Administrator Dee Schippert to explain to the committee the reasoning for needing to review the policy. Schippert provided Anderson with problem resolution forms from the manual for two of her employees. Schippert explained each of her employees signed off on the manuals stating they had read them. The vacation policy reads "Beginning year 8 through 14 years receives 15 working days". She currently has two employees in their eighth year of employment that only received 10 working days. Anderson explained each employee is employed one year before receiving vacation. It is standard business practice to earn vacation in arrears. The committee agrees the verbiage in the policy needs to be changed to read more clearly. Anderson said he would speak with States Attorney Jim Devine and Dave Hibben to get their professional opinions.

Correspondence includes a letter and donation request from the Show Bus Public Transportation program. Bills noted the County gave a donation to the Show Bus as "start up" money when the program began.

Under new business, Shure informed the committee the IRS has changed the mileage rate to .54 cents per mile. Also, Anderson said the committee will discuss sick days.

As there was no further business to come before the committee, it was moved by Rayman and seconded by Behrends to adjourn at 9:46 A.M.

The meeting was called to order.

There were no public comments.

Management Chairman Lyle Behrends stated Northern Illinois Alliance and D & S Farms submitted bids for fertilizer application. Behrends said other potential bidders felt it was difficult to bid based on the variable rate soil analysis on a per ton basis. They would rather bid on a per field basis. Behrends also noted issues have been raised about previous tenants applying their own fertilizer. Business Manager of D & S Farms Paul Corzine said he understands the committee's concerns with the difficulty they have had with previous tenants but he assures D & S Farms just wants to do their job. The committee discussed whether or not to allow D & S Farms to bid on the fertilizer application and if bids should be opened today or if we should request variable rate bids. It was moved by Dan Joyce and seconded by Larry Hasbargen to allow D & S Farms to bid on the fertilizer application for the County Farm. A roll call vote was taken. Crow, nay; Shure, aye; Zumwalt, nay; Alt, aye; Hasbargen, aye; Joyce, aye; Behrends, nay. Motion carried. Donna Crow stated she would like to see other bidders but Adam Zumwalt said others will not bid knowing D & S Farms has the ability to bid. Behrends told the committee the future contract needs to state the tenant cannot bid on fertilizer application.

Behrends opened the fertilizer bids. They are as follows:

- Northern Illinois Alliance
 - Potash, application and hauling 22.53 tons
 - DAP, application and hauling 7.94 tons
 - Limestone, application and hauling 0.00
 - Total Potash, DAP, application and hauling \$12,097.00
- D & S Farms
 - Potash, application and hauling \$350 per ton
 - DAP, application and hauling \$480 per ton
 - Limestone, application and hauling \$18 per ton
 - Total Potash, DAP, application and hauling \$11,696.70

It was moved by Hasbargen and seconded by Charlie Alt to accept the low bid submitted by D & S Farms for fertilizer application. A roll call vote was taken. Crow, nay; Shure, aye; Zumwalt, nay; Alt, aye; Hasbargen, aye; Joyce, nay; Behrends, nay. Motion failed.

Mr. Corzine told the committee he is working with IDOT and AT&T on the tile issue. He provided a list of items to be applied to the County Farm for the committee's review and

approval. It was moved by Zumwalt and seconded by Joyce to approve the 2016 projected products to be applied on the County Farm. Motion carried by a voice vote.

Maintenance Supervisor Clyde Meents reported on the following:

- The former Zoning office was cleaned out to accommodate the new Animal Control office.
- Meents is still working on the updated signage for the Administrative Center.

The committee discussed access to the soccer field and the possibility of an easement being granted. Behrends said an easement from Sam Martin's existing easement along the east edge of the grass extending down to the soccer field is the new proposal being given to the Watseka Park District. This will still allow the Park District access to the tree line and parking lot.

The committee reviewed the claims. It was moved by Alt and seconded by Zumwalt to pay the bills subject to County Board approval. Motion carried by a roll call vote.

The department heads gave their monthly reports.

- County Clerk Lisa Fancher reported January 7th the State Board of Elections will certify the state and federal candidates that go on the ballot, and the Clerk's Office can complete ballot set-up. February 4th is the first day to early vote or vote by mail. There are two polling places being changed in Watseka. In Tax Extension, Fancher said they are waiting for drainage district levies to be certified from the Circuit Clerk's Office. It takes approximately 2 weeks to enter all Drainage District levies including working out any problems. At this time, all other levies are being entered fund by fund. There are approximately 144 taxing districts. Also, letters were sent out yesterday to the secretaries and clerks of all units of government requesting their lists of individuals required to file a Statement of Economic Interest. Lastly, 1099 Interest forms are being prepared for tax buyers.
- Animal Control Director Dr. Youssef gave his report for December. He also spoke about the temporary shelter set up due to the flood which housed 11 dogs and 2 cats. He said all of these animals have been picked up by their owners. Youssef said his office began distributing new dog tags and forms to the veterinarians in the area.

Ray Guttendorf, Legislative Aid for Tom Bennett's Office, spoke to the committee about a recycling event that was held last year in Watseka. He said they are hiring a new company and partnering with other organizations for the event. This event will take place in April or May and some of the items accepted for recycling are electronics, flags, keys, hearing aids and cell phones. He explained his office is interested in working with the County but they do not know the steps required to request funds. Tax Chairman Dale Schultz believes this is an event that needs to happen, however, the funds are not currently budgeted. The committee would need to discuss the matter further once a dollar amount is known. Mr. Guttendorf said he would be able to get dollar amount possibly later this week and present it to the Finance Committee.
